Summary

- **Chiropractic Educator:** I have taught courses in anatomy, x-ray, technique, diagnosis, ethics and practice management. My philosophy of education has guided my attempts to be innovative as well as relevant. When the Faculty of the Year award was initiated in 1982, I was the first winner. My ratings by students have always been excellent, and my peer reviews without reproach. I was the first Sherman faculty member to teach using a webpage and the first faculty member to put lectures in digital format.
- **Administrator:** As Dean of Students, Academic Dean, Clinic Director and Dean of Clinical Sciences I led departments and divisions. I attempted to be well informed in every aspect, but relied on good people to do their jobs well without interference. I have never done well as a micro-manager, but I do pay attention to details while focusing on the big picture.
- **Service to Profession:** As a member of the South Carolina Board of Examiners for eight years I was able to guarantee fair treatment on license examinations for Sherman graduates. As a SCASA founding officer I participated in the creation of an accrediting agency to rival CCE. I served on two of the three college visiting teams for SCASA. As an FCLB member for 12 years I helped make sure that Sherman graduates were allowed to take state license exams. As an ACC Technique Council member I served on the committee that removed George's Test from the Standard of Care. As a National Board Test Committee member for 10 years on both Part II and Part IV I was able to contribute hundreds of items for exams that tested knowledge of traditional chiropractic topics. As a Standard of Care expert witness I have participated in 30-40 malpractice actions as a defense witness with excellent results.
- **Community Service:** For 38 years I have participated in Spartanburg community activities through parent groups in the schools, and youth sports activities. Our chiropractic practice has provided service to athletes at Converse College, Wofford College, Spartanburg Methodist College, USC Upstate and local high schools. My son and I have spoken to numerous service clubs, retirement groups and career days. I have an excellent reputation in the business community of Spartanburg and have provided chiropractic services for hundreds of local business leaders and community leaders.
